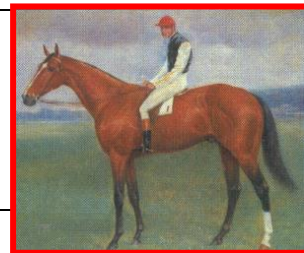

Vale Judge John Gallop AM, RFD, QC



The Carbine Club lost a beloved and long term member this week with the passing of John Gallop, Patron of the Carbine Club of the ACT.



Our friend John had a distinguished career in the law – he was a successful barrister in Canberra and was made a Queen's Counsel in 1976. The following year, John was appointed to the bench of the Federal Court of Australia and the Supreme Court of the Northern Territory. John became a judge of the ACT Supreme Court in 1982. He went on to be appointed a presidential member of the AAT, president of the Defence Force Discipline Appeal Tribunal and a judge of the Supreme Court of Christmas Island. He served with distinction until July 2000, retiring on his seventieth birthday. John was made a Member of the Order of Australia in 1998.

John was a wonderful supporter of our Club, before becoming Patron of the CCACT he was a long term President and a great supporter of the

Club Congress where he again distinguished as a raconteur and a bloody good bloke to be around – a great loss to his family, the community and to the Club. John is pictured above in a visit to CCPNG.

Tales of Carbine - Two Runs in One Day

In the era when our champ was racing it was not uncommon for horses to race more than once on the same day, and Carbine was no exception. In his remarkable career he ran twice in a day on five occasions amassing nine wins and one second; the pattern of racing for Carbine was one of many runs in the course of a carnival - as a 3YO he ran five times in the course of a week at Flemington winning 3 from 8f to 24f (1 mile to 3 miles), and in April he raced 5 times in 6 days at Randwick for 4 wins covering a remarkable nine and a half miles of racing in 6 days including two wins on the one day.

No wonder he had his own post cards!
